Information is also given relating to vaccination, migration, and the weather.

I beg to acknowledge the valuable assistance rendered by the Chief Medical Officer of the Ministry of Home Affairs, who has advised on certain aspects of the Report. I also desire to record my appreciation of the courtesy shown by the Registrars-General of England and Wales, Scotland, and the Irish Free State, in kindly furnishing information relating to the areas under their respective administrations.

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# ANNUAL REPORT OF THE REGISTRAR-GENERAL FOR NORTHERN IRELAND

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## REPORT

### SECTION I.—REGISTRATION (*Arrangements and Administration*).

**1. Introductory.**—The administrative functions of the office of the Registrar-General comprise the registration of births, deaths, marriages, vaccinations, and adoptions, and the provision or supervision of machinery for dealing with preliminaries to marriages other than those taking place according to the rites of the Roman Catholic Church. An outline of the arrangements in force, together with some information on certain aspects of the work incidental to the discharge of these functions, is given in the following paragraphs.

**2. Births and Deaths.**—The Acts governing the registration of births and deaths in Northern Ireland, which dates from 1st January, 1864, are Acts 26 & 27 Vic., cap. 11, and 43 & 44 Vic., cap. 13. With a few exceptions the Dispensary Districts constitute Registrars' Districts, and the Dispensary Medical Officer is the Registrar. Poor Law Unions constitute Superintendent Registrars' Districts, and the Clerk of the Union is the Superintendent Registrar, with whom the filled registers are deposited.

Information of a birth must be given to the Registrar within 42 days by (1) the father or the mother, or (2) the occupier of the house in which the child is born, or (3) a person present at the birth, or (4) the person having charge of the child. In the case of a living new-born child found exposed, the persons responsible for giving information (within seven days in this case) are (1) the person finding the child, or (2) any person in whose charge such child may be placed.

Information of a death must be given to the Registrar within five days, by (1) a relative present at the death, or in attendance during the last illness, or (2) a relative dwelling or being in the same district as the deceased, or (3) a person present at the death, or (4) the occupier of the house in which the death took place, or (5) an inmate of such house, or (6) the person causing the body to be buried. Where a death takes place, or a dead body is found, elsewhere than in a house, the persons required to give information are (1) a relative or (2) a person present at the death, or (3) the person finding the body, or (4) any person taking charge of the body, or (5) the person causing the body to be buried. Where an inquest is held on a dead body, the death is registered by means of a certificate containing the required information, transmitted by the Coroner to the Registrar.

**3. Marriages.**—The registration of marriages, other than those performed by the Roman Catholic clergy, commenced at 1st April, 1845, the relative Acts being 7 & 8 Vic., cap. 81; 26 & 27 Vic., cap. 27; and

34 & 35 Vic., cap. 49. Marriages performed by the Roman Catholic clergy have been registered since 1st January, 1864, under the Act 26 & 27 Vic., cap. 90.

Marriages other than those by the Roman Catholic clergy are registered by the officiating minister (or in the cases of the Jews and the Society of Friends, by specially appointed officers), or by the Registrar appointed under the Act 7 & 8 Vic., cap. 81, whose district corresponds to a Poor Law Union. These marriages, except those recorded by the Registrar, are registered in duplicate books, one of which, when filled, is lodged with the Registrar.

Marriages performed by the Roman Catholic clergy are registered by means of a form of certificate, obtained from the Registrar appointed under the Act 26 & 27 Vic., cap. 90, which is signed immediately after the ceremony and returned to the Registrar. This officer is in almost all cases the Registrar of Births and Deaths, and the filled Registers are deposited with the Superintendent Registrar of Births and Deaths, who is also Superintendent Registrar of these marriages.

**4. Vaccinations.**—The registration of vaccinations is assigned by the Act 26 & 27 Vic., cap. 52, to the Registrar of Births and Deaths, who is also required to deliver to each informant of a birth a notice requiring the child to be vaccinated. Regulations governing the Registrars' duties are made by the Registrar-General.

**5. Adoptions.**—Under the Adoption of Children Act (Northern Ireland), 1929, a register, called the Adopted Children Register, is kept in the General Register Office, to which the Adoption Orders made by the Courts (the High Court or the County Courts) are communicated. A certified copy of an entry in this register is evidence of adoption, and is also evidence of the date of birth, if that date is recorded in the entry.

**6. Preliminaries to Marriage.**—When both parties to a marriage are members of the Church of Ireland, the marriage may take place after publication of banns (an alternative to which is a certificate by the Registrar that notice has been given to him) or by special licence granted by a Bishop. The most usual procedure, however, in case of marriages according to the rites of the Church of Ireland is by ordinary licence, issued by a person appointed by the Bishop of the Diocese to issue licences. In this case it is sufficient if one party is a member of the Church of Ireland or other Protestant Episcopal Church. Each licenser must on appointment enter into a bond with the Registrar-General for the due discharge of his duties.

Marriages between persons both of whom are Presbyterians may take place after publication of banns. The Moderator of the General Assembly of the Presbyterian Church, and the Moderators of certain other Presbyterian bodies, are empowered to grant special licences in cases in which both parties belong to the same denomination as the Moderator. The great majority of marriages in Presbyterian Churches, however, take place by ordinary licence, issued by a minister appointed for that purpose by the Presbytery. It is sufficient in this procedure if only one of the parties is a Presbyterian. Each minister, on his

appointment to issue licences, must enter into a bond with the Registrar-General for the due discharge of his duties.

Members of denominations other than those mentioned above, marrying according to their religious usages, and also persons (irrespective of their religious denominations) marrying in a Registrar's Office, obtain their authority—either certificate or licence, but almost always the latter—from the Registrar of the district.

Marriage procedure in cases where both parties are Roman Catholics and where the marriage is performed according to the rites of the Roman Catholic Church is regulated by the laws of the Church.

**7. Facilities for Searches, etc., and Fees.**—Certified copies of all entries of births, deaths, and marriages registered each quarter are forwarded to the Registrar-General, General Register Office, Belfast. Those relating to the years prior to 1922 are, however, still in the General Register Office, Dublin.

Searches may be made either in the original registers or indexes in local custody or in the indexes in the General Register Office, and certified copies obtained from either source.

A “general search” is a search during six successive days in the case of marriages, and during six successive hours in the case of births and deaths, the object of the search not being stated. A “particular search” is a search over any period of five years for any given entry.

**8. Records in the General Register Office, Belfast.**—It will be observed that the following list of records in the General Register Office includes certain records of events occurring out of Northern Ireland:—

(a) Certified copies of Registers of Births, Deaths, and Marriages registered in Northern Ireland on and after 1st January, 1922.

(b) Returns of Births at sea of children of Northern Irish fathers, and Returns of Deaths at sea of H.M. Northern Irish subjects, from 1st January, 1922.

(c) Returns of Births abroad of children of Northern Irish parents, and Returns of Deaths abroad of H.M. Northern Irish subjects, certified by British Consuls, from 1st January, 1922.

(d) Returns under the Registration of Births, Deaths, and Marriages (Army) Act, 1879, *i.e.*, deaths and marriages of Northern Irish officers or soldiers, and births, deaths, and marriages in their families outside the United Kingdom, from 1st January, 1923.

(e) Records of the adoptions of children authorised by the Courts pursuant to the Adoption of Children Act (Northern Ireland), 1929, from 1st July, 1930.

**9. Local Organisation.**—The staff of local officers engaged in registration consists of—

27 Registrars of Marriages other than Roman Catholic;

27 Superintendent Registrars of Births, Deaths, and Roman Catholic Marriages; and

179 Registrars of Births, Deaths, and Roman Catholic Marriages. Each of these officers appoints an Assistant or Deputy.

**10. Licensers of Marriages.**—The number of Licensers of the Church of Ireland holding office at the end of the year 1934 was 70, the number of appointments made during the year being 4. The corresponding figures for 1933 were 72 and 9 respectively.



Licensers of the Presbyterian Churches holding office at the end of 1934 numbered 125, the number of appointments made during the year being 2. The corresponding figures for 1933 were 124 and 8 respectively.

**11. Buildings licensed or registered for marriages.**—The arrangements for the registration of marriages already described necessitate a register of places of worship in which marriages may be solemnised (except as regards marriages amongst Roman Catholics, Jews, and members of the Society of Friends). The numbers of places of worship licensed or registered for marriages as at the 31st December in each of the years 1932, 1933, and 1934 were as follows:—

**12. State of Registration.**—The registration of births or deaths which have not been recorded within a year of their occurrence can be effected only on the authority of the Registrar-General. During the year 1934 authority was granted for the registration of 149 births and 19 deaths. In 1933 the registration of 105 births and 13 deaths was authorised.

Although the state of registration undoubtedly still leaves much to be desired, there are indications of a slow improvement.

The purposes for which evidence of age is required are now so numerous, and the disadvantages attaching to inability to produce a birth certificate so serious, that it may be conjectured that these considerations are impressing upon parents the necessity of having their children's births recorded as the law requires. The arrangements referred to in the Report for 1932, under which birth entries in the County Boroughs of Belfast and Londonderry are compared with notifications of births under the Notifications of Births Act, 1907, are yielding valuable results, and arrangements for such comparisons in other urban areas have been made.

As a rule, if the parents or other persons concerned, on discovering an omission to register a birth within the statutory time, are willing to take the required steps to have late registration effected, they are facilitated in so doing, and no recourse is had to prosecution for the original offence. Obviously, such an omission is more easily rectified in the earlier period of a child's life than in later years, and, therefore, the earlier any such omission is brought to light, the greater is the possibility of avoiding for the child the grave inconvenience of being unable to obtain a birth certificate.

It is to be feared that the need for prompt registration of deaths is still to some extent unappreciated, particularly in rural areas, with the result that a number of deaths entirely escape registration. Cases have

occurred where the absence of registration has been discovered years after the event, and has been a source of much inconvenience to relatives of the deceased persons. Although facilities for late registration are afforded, it is often a matter of considerable difficulty for the persons concerned to establish satisfactorily the date of death.

In many cases no records of interments are kept in burial grounds, which differ greatly in the matter of control. These differences present a serious obstacle to any scheme of general application for establishing a comparison between deaths and burials.

**13. Prosecutions.**—There were six cases in 1934 in which prosecutions were instituted, through the Chief Crown Solicitor, for offences against the Registration Acts. Four of these were cases of failure to register births, and in the remaining two the charge was that of giving false information to a Registrar for entry in the register. In one of the latter cases, a second person was charged with aiding and abetting.

One of the cases of failure to register a birth was withdrawn, the party paying the costs incurred and effecting registration. All the other defendants were convicted and fined.

**14. Legitimacy Act (N.I.), 1928.**—Under this Act an illegitimate child whose parents have married is, subject to certain conditions, legitimated, and the Registrar-General is empowered to authorise the re-registration of the birth. During 1934 the re-registration of the births of 100 children was authorised under the Act, the figures for 1932 and 1933 being 81 and 64 respectively.

**15. Adoption of Children Act (N.I.), 1929.**—The children whose adoptions were recorded in the Adopted Children Register during 1934 numbered 99, the figures for 1932 and 1933 being 55 and 72 respectively.

**16. Searches and Certificates.**—As stated above, the Head Office copies of the original records of births, deaths, and marriages registered in Northern Ireland for the years prior to 1922 are still in the hands of the Registrar-General, Dublin. An indication of the extent to which Government Departments and the public have utilised the facilities for searching in the indexes and obtaining certificates from records in the General Register Office for Northern Ireland is afforded by the following table:—

Many thousands of certificates are issued annually by the local registration officers in Northern Ireland, who, in general, retain the custody of all original registrations effected in their areas.

**SECTION II.—STATISTICS.****§1. SUMMARY OF REGISTRATION.**

**1. Introductory.**—The statistics of births and deaths for the year 1984 already published in the Registrar-General's weekly and quarterly returns are provisional, the figures, however, in this Report may be regarded as final. More comprehensive statistics derived from registration and census records appear in the "Registrar-General's Review of Vital Statistics of Northern Ireland and Life Tables (1926)," published in September, 1931.

The value of the statistical information concerning deaths contained in the Registrar-General's Annual Reports and other publications is to a large extent dependent on the degree of care and accuracy with which the members of the medical profession enter the required particulars on the form of medical certificate of the cause of death. The particulars so given are incorporated in the death entries, and thus in every case in which a person had been attended in his or her last illness by a medical practitioner, the medical certificate given by the latter forms the basis upon which the cause of death is classified.

In the case of the death of a person who had not been medically attended in his or her last illness, and no inquest had been held, the cause of death is entered in the register from such information as the informant of the death can supply to the Registrar. (See para. 16, page 25, as to uncertified deaths.)

For the purpose of the Registrar-General's Annual Reports the classifications adopted are those shown in the "Manual of the International List of Causes of Death, as adapted for use in England and Wales, Scotland, and Northern Ireland," published by H.M. Stationery Office.

Abstract VII shows the deaths classified under the headings of the International Intermediate List (slightly amplified in the case of tuberculosis), while the causes shown in Abstract V, and certain of the tables in the text, are in accordance with the International Abridged List. The reference numbers given for the diseases in the tables and abstracts are those of the Detailed International List, and the numbers of the Intermediate List are also shown in the case of Abstract VII.

In general in the tables and abstracts, dots (.) are used to indicate nil (0), and dashes (—) are used to indicate that information cannot or is not intended to be given.

*Throughout the Report births and deaths have been allocated to the district of normal residence; thus, births have been assigned to the districts containing the normal residence of the parents, and deaths to the districts containing the normal residence of the deceased persons.*

**2. Marriages, Births, and Deaths Registered.**—The results of the year's registration show increases in the marriage and birth rates, and a decrease in the death rate. The death rate is the lowest and the marriage rate the highest recorded for Northern Ireland as a separate administrative unit.

**3. Vaccinations.**—As returned by the Registrars, the Successful Primary Vaccinations during the year numbered 21,164, the number

of births registered during the year being 25,365. The number of Successful Primary Vaccinations is thus about 83 per cent. of the total number of births registered, which is the same as in 1933.

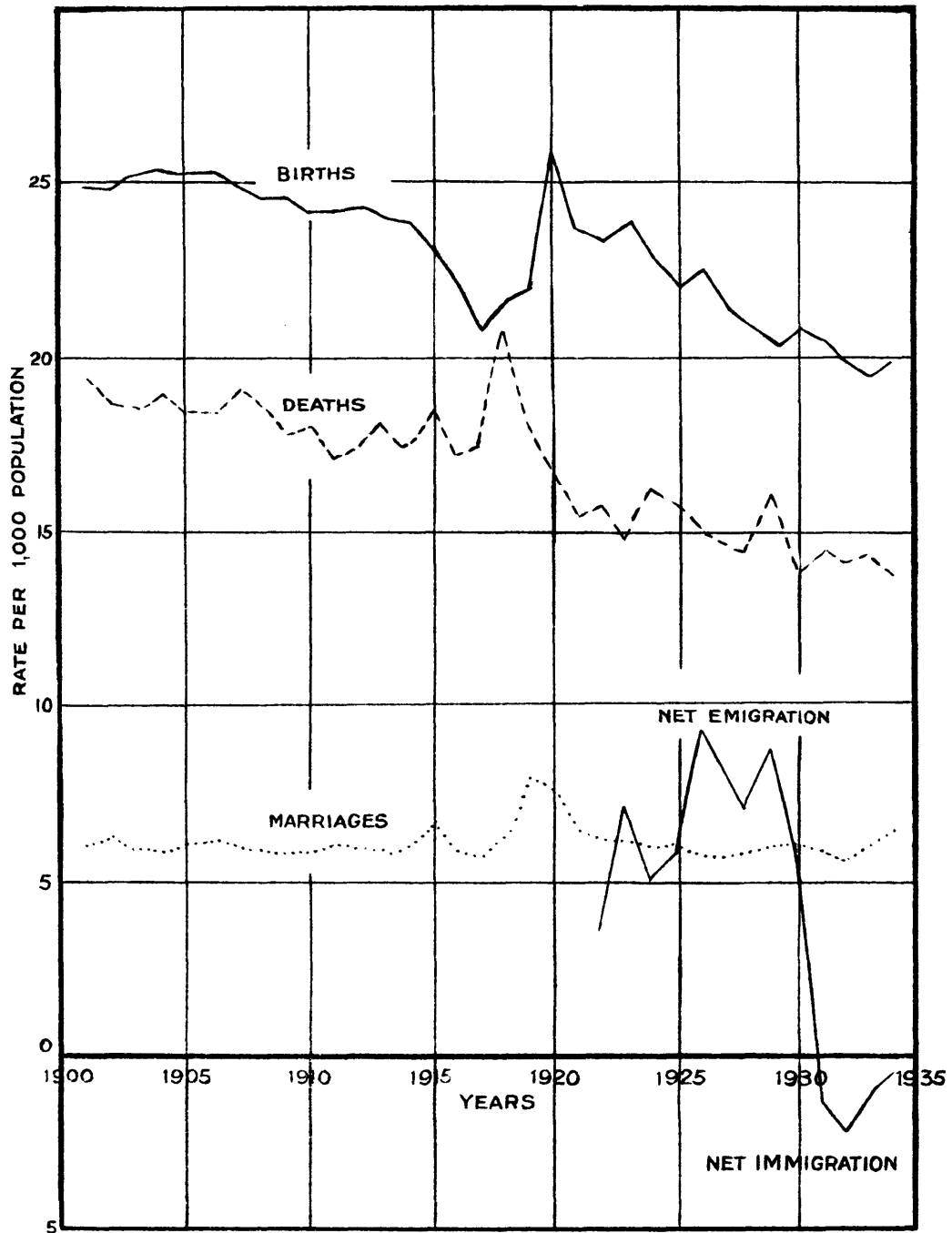
## § 2. MARRIAGES.

**1. Number and Rate.**—Marriages registered during the year numbered 8,230, the rate being 6.43 per 1,000 of the estimated population. This rate is 0.43 above that for the year 1933. It will be observed from Diagram I that, apart from fluctuations during and immediately following the Great War, the marriage rates in Northern Ireland remained remarkably steady throughout the period 1901 to 1933. The high marriage rate of 1934 is, however, somewhat remarkable.

**2. Method of Celebration.**—Table B shows for Northern Ireland the marriages registered during the period 1924 to 1934 according to methods of celebration. Marriages taking place in Registrars' offices in the year under review represented 7.1 per cent. of the total marriages, as compared with about 4.5 per cent. in 1921. It will be observed that the increase in the number of marriages in 1934 is distributed over the various denominations, a marked increase in the number of Presbyterian marriages being noticeable.

**3. Civil Conditions.**—Of the total marriages, 91.8 per cent. were of bachelors and spinsters, 5.7 per cent. were of widowers and spinsters, 1.3 per cent. were of widowers and widows, and 1.2 per cent. were of bachelors and widows. Of the men married, 7.0 per cent. were widowers and 2.6 per cent. of the women married were widows; in 8 out of every 100 marriages, one or both of the contracting parties had been married before. It should be noted that divorced men and women who marry are included as bachelors and spinsters for the purpose of these calculations. The marriages of divorced persons are shown below Abstract II.

**4. Marriages in each Quarter.**—Of the total marriages registered, 18.2 per cent. were in the first quarter of the year, 24.2 per cent. in the second, 30.6 per cent. in the third, and 27.0 per cent. in the fourth.

**5. Marriages of Minors.**—Of the males married during the year, 3.4 per cent. were under the age of 21 years, which is the same as for the previous year, and of the females, 13.3 per cent. were under 21 as compared with 13.7 per cent. in 1933.

**6. Signatures by "Mark."**—Of the husbands, 98.7 per cent. signed the marriage registers or certificates by writing their names and the remainder signed by "mark," while 99.3 per cent. of the wives wrote their names and the remainder signed by "mark." In 1924 the percentages were 97.8 and 98.0 respectively.

## § 8. BIRTHS.

**1. Number and Rate.**—The births registered during the year numbered 25,865, an increase of 764 as compared with the previous year. The birth rate was 19.8 per 1,000 of the estimated population, being 0.4 above the rate for the previous year. An examination of Diagram I reveals that the birth rate in Northern Ireland has, in general, fallen over the past thirty-four years, with the exception of the war years and the period immediately following, when extreme fluctuations in the rate were experienced. The increase in the birth rate in 1934 follows an increase in the marriage rate in the previous year. Illegitimate births numbered 1,309, being an increase of 72 over the number recorded for 1933; the proportion to total births (5.16 per cent.) being the highest recorded during the period covered by these Reports.

**2. Fertility.**—Comparative fertility rates for the various parts of the British Isles, as at successive census dates, are shown in Diagram II. It may be inferred from this Diagram that, at the present time, of the married women in Northern Ireland, aged 15-44 years, on the average, approximately two out of every ten give birth to children in any particular year.

**3. Proportion of Males to Females.**—The proportion of male births to every 1,000 female births was 1,079. The corresponding proportions for each of the years 1929–33 were 1,055, 1,038, 1,052, 1,052, and 1,058 respectively. In the case of illegitimate births there were 112 males to every 100 females.

**4. Births in each Quarter.**—Of the total births registered, 25.2 per cent. were in the first quarter of the year, 27.0 per cent. in the second, 24.4 per cent. in the third, and 23.4 per cent. in the fourth.

**5. Multiple Births.**—Of the 25,365 children whose births were registered during the year, 24,769 were born singly and 596 children were twins. Still-births not being registered in Northern Ireland, a birth of one live child and one still-born child is regarded as a single birth, and a birth of two live children and one still-born child as a twin birth, and so on.

**6. County and Urban and Rural Birth Rates.**—Table D shows the birth rate experienced in each County and County Borough in Northern Ireland during the year, and also the rates for the aggregates of Urban and Rural Areas. From this it will be seen that Londonderry Co. Borough again experienced the highest birth rate and Co. Fermanagh the lowest. The rate for the aggregate of Urban Areas exceeded that for the Rural Areas.

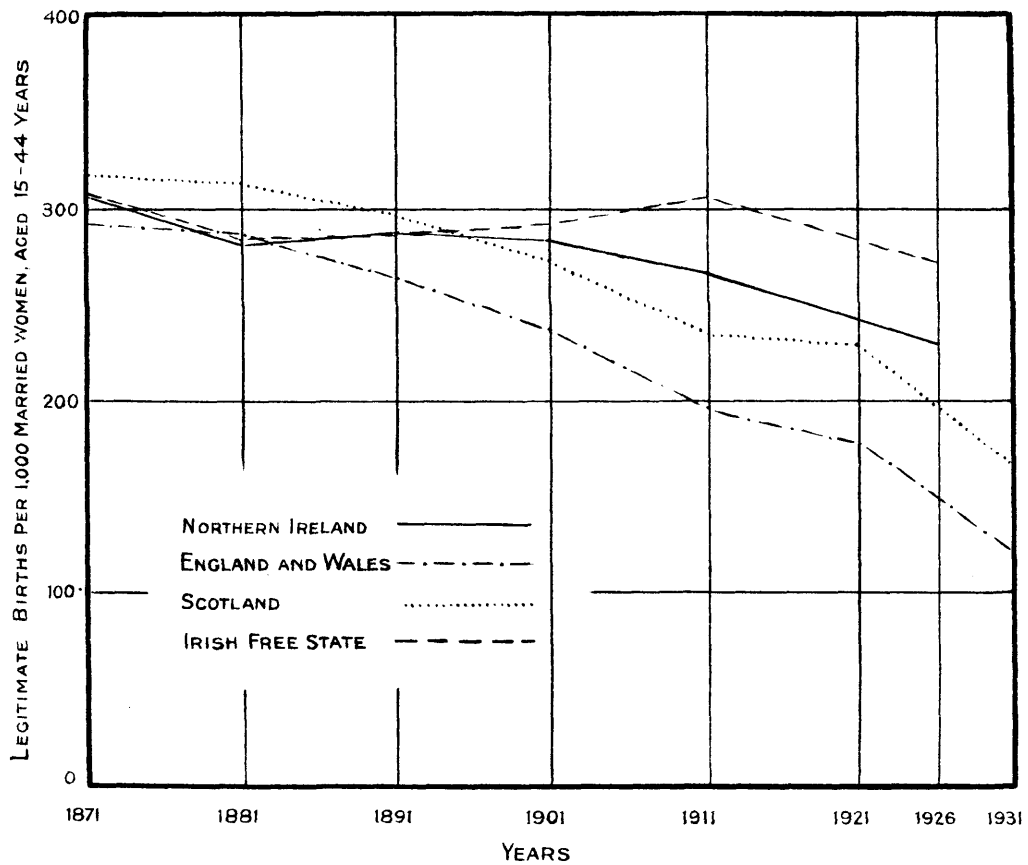

#### § 4. DEATHS.

**1. Number and Rate.**—The deaths registered during the year numbered 17,521, a decrease of 633 as compared with the previous year. The death rate was 13.7 per 1,000 of the estimated population, being 0.6 below the rate for 1933. Diagram I exhibits the general downward trend of the death rate in Northern Ireland during the period 1901 to 1934. The rate for 1934 is the lowest recorded for Northern Ireland since 1901.

Of the total deaths, 8,727 were of males and 8,794 were of females, the equivalent annual death rates being 14.0 and 13.4 per 1,000 of the male and female estimated populations respectively.

**2. Deaths in each Quarter.**—The deaths registered in the four quarters of the year give equivalent annual death rates of 15.9, 14.4, 11.0, and 13.5 in the March, June, September, and December quarters respectively.

**3. Deaths in Institutions.**—The numbers of deaths occurring in institutions in each of the years 1925–34 are shown in Abstract IX. 25.9 per cent. of the deaths registered in 1934 took place in institutions (2.5 per cent. in public mental hospitals, 10.9 per cent. in workhouses and workhouse hospitals, 3.7 per cent. in district hospitals, and 8.8 per cent. in other hospitals and infirmaries), and the remaining 74.1 per cent. occurred “at their own homes, etc.” It will be observed from Abstract IX that the percentage of deaths taking place in institutions has risen from 17.7 in 1925 to 25.9 in 1934. These figures may be regarded as an index to the increasing tendency of the people to resort to institutions in cases of serious illness.

The numbers of deaths taking place in District Hospitals, which have increased from 276 in 1924 to 652 in 1934, are, no doubt, also affected by this tendency, but here the increase is mainly to be attributed to the increased number of these institutions which have replaced Workhouse Infirmaries.

**4. Standardised Death Rates.**—In Table E of this report standardised death rates for Northern Ireland have been calculated to correct for variations in age and sex distribution of the population, thus enabling more reliable comparisons to be made with the mortality rates, similarly standardised, experienced in other countries. As mortality is highest in infancy and old age, and generally higher in the male than in the female sex, one population, as compared with another, may be much more favourably constituted as regards age and sex, and the real difference in mortality between them thus obscured if only crude rates are compared.

The standardised death rate for a community, as calculated in this report, is the death rate that would emerge if the mortality rates of that community, at various ages and sexes, were to prevail in a population selected as being of standard age and sex distribution.

The standard population adopted is that of England and Wales in 1901, and since this population is also used as standard by the Registrar-General, England and Wales, it is possible to show comparable death rates between that country and Northern Ireland (see Table E).

The actual method of calculating the standardised rates, which is also that used by the Registrar-General, England and Wales, is fully described in his Annual Reports for the years 1911 (pages xxvii–xxxi) and 1918 (page xx).

From Table E it will be seen that the crude death rates are, in general, reduced to a greater extent by standardisation in the case of Northern Ireland than in the case of England and Wales. This is, of course, to be expected, since the proportion of children and aged persons is appreciably higher in Northern Ireland. Perhaps the most noticeable feature of the comparison of standardised rates is the relatively high rates for females in Northern Ireland, these rates being on an average in the years 1926–34 about 94 per cent. of the males rates, whereas the corresponding ratio for the England and Wales rates is only about 81 per cent. Diagram III compares the standardised death rates in Northern Ireland with those in England and Wales for the years 1926–34.

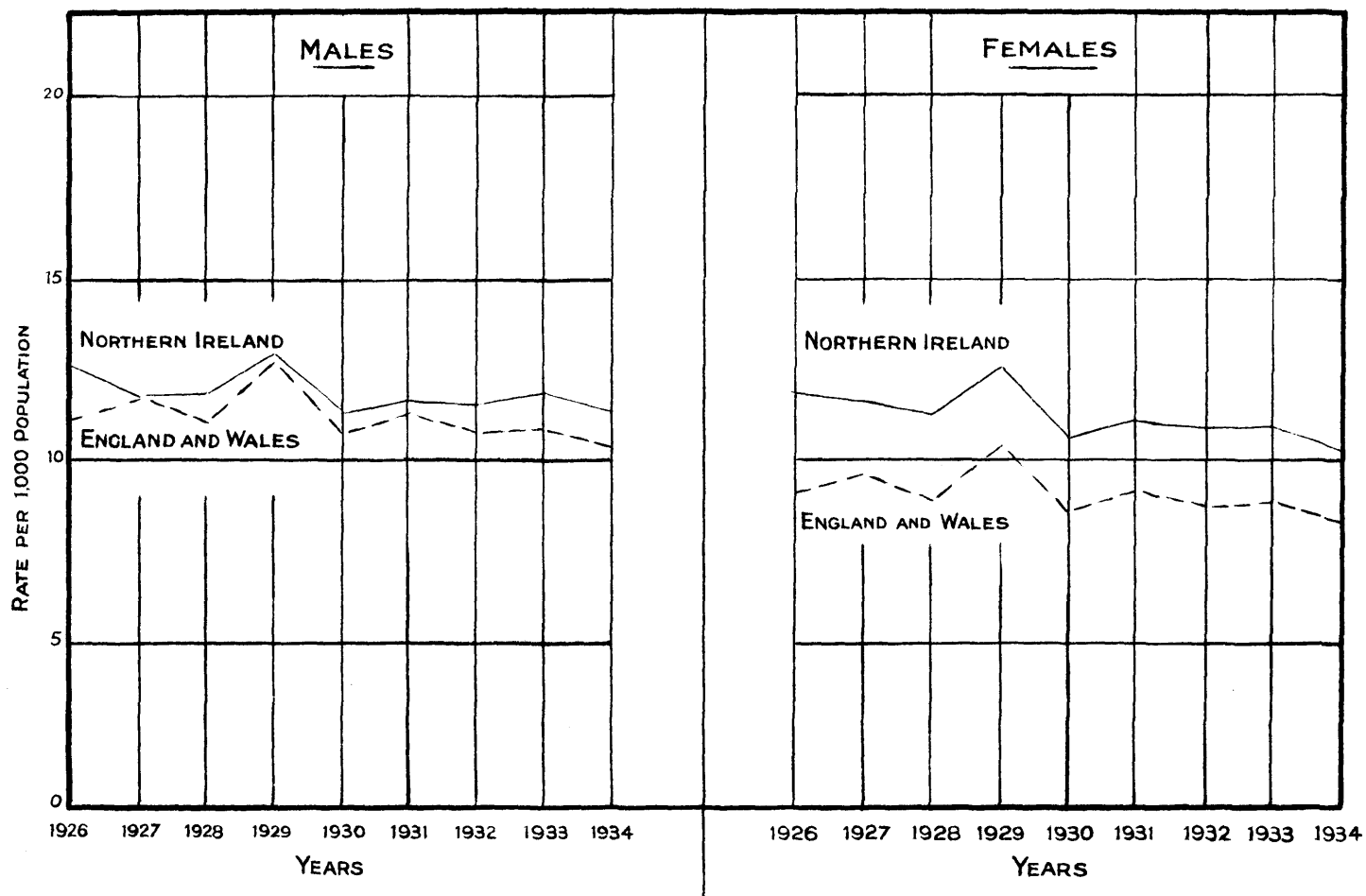

**5. Proportion of Deaths from the Principal Causes.**—Table F shows the deaths from the principal causes as proportions per 1,000 of the total deaths in certain age groups. It will be seen from this table that, for all ages taken together, heart disease bears the greatest proportion to the total deaths, which is the usual experience; and that the deaths from this cause occur mainly among persons of fairly advanced ages. The proportions are high also for senility, cancer, tuberculosis, cerebral hæmorrhage, pneumonia, congenital debility, etc., and bronchitis.

At ages under one year, apart from congenital debility, etc., the highest proportion of deaths is caused by pneumonia, diarrhoea and enteritis, bronchitis, and whooping-cough.

Between the ages of one and ten the highest proportions are caused by the common infectious diseases, diseases of the digestive system,

tuberculosis (the deaths from which are mainly due to tuberculosis of the central nervous system), violence, and pneumonia. It is noteworthy that violence is usually prominent as a cause of death at these ages, and particularly at the ages between five and ten, most of such deaths being due to burns, scalds, and motor accidents.

Between the ages of ten and thirty-five, tuberculosis (principally of the respiratory system) causes by far the largest proportion of deaths.

From age thirty-five onwards, heart disease, senility, cancer, cerebral hæmorrhage, tuberculosis, pneumonia, bronchitis, and nephritis are responsible for the largest proportion of the total mortality.

Tables G and H show for each of the principal causes the numbers of deaths and the death rates for each year since 1925, together with corresponding particulars for the Irish Free State in respect of the year 1934.

**6. Deaths from Epidemic Diseases.**—The numbers of deaths from scarlet fever show an increase when compared with the numbers registered in 1933; but decreases are shown in the deaths from typhoid and paratyphoid fevers, measles, whooping-cough, influenza, and diarrhoea under 2 years. The numbers registered as having been caused by diphtheria were the same as the previous year.

**7. Influenza.**—The deaths from influenza during the year numbered 839, giving a rate of 0.27 per 1,000, compared with a rate of 0.69 for the year 1933. As usual, the majority of the deaths from this disease occurred in the first quarter of the year.

**8. Tuberculosis.**—The death rate from this cause of 1.12 per 1,000 is 0.03 below the rate for 1933. Diagram IV shows that the death rate in Northern Ireland from all forms of tuberculosis has declined very steadily from 1901 to 1934. The only material break in the general trend of improvement occurs during the period covered by the war years. The crude death rate in Northern Ireland from this disease in 1934, whilst slightly lower than that for the Irish Free State, is still higher than the corresponding rates for England and Wales, and Scotland.

From Table F it will be seen that tuberculous diseases have caused 469 deaths in every 1,000 between the ages of 15 and 25, and 396 per 1,000 between 25 and 35. Further, from Abstract VII it appears that nearly one-half of the deaths from all forms of tuberculous disease during 1934 occurred between the ages of 15 and 35. The reduction in the proportion of deaths from this disease at ages under 35, and the increase in the proportion occurring at ages of 35 and over which was revealed in 1933, were maintained during the year 1934.

Tuberculosis is in general much more prevalent in the cities and towns than in the country districts. In 1934 the rate per 1,000 for all urban areas was 1.29 and for rural areas 0.99. The rates in 1933 were 1.38 and 0.93 respectively.

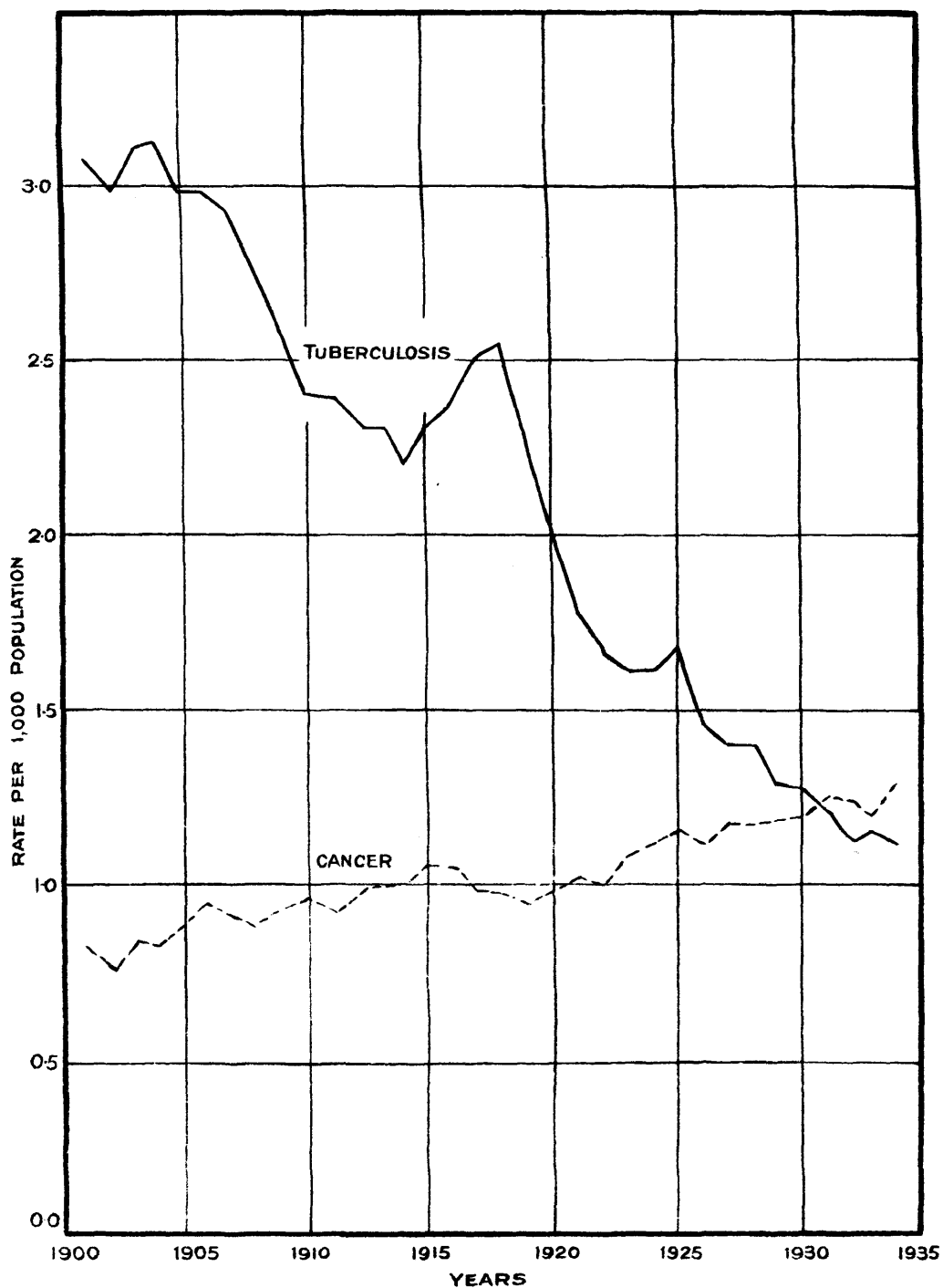
Tuberculosis of the respiratory system accounted for 75 per cent. of the total deaths from tuberculosis.

The abstracts of causes of death give particulars regarding the sexes and ages of the persons who died from the various forms of tuberculous disease during the year, and also the deaths from tuberculosis allocated to each urban and rural district. Table J affords comparison of the summarised figures for 1934 with those for each of the ten preceding years. Table K shows comparisons of the summarised figures for each of the six counties of Northern Ireland and Belfast County Borough.

**9. Cancer.**—Under this heading are included deaths returned as from carcinoma, sarcoma, cancer, or malignant disease.

The crude death rate for cancer in Northern Ireland during 1934 was 1.29 per 1,000, which is an increase of 0.09 on the rate for 1933. From Diagram IV it will be seen that the cancer death rate has increased more or less steadily over the period 1901 to 1934. This Diagram, which contrasts the mortality from cancer with that from tuberculosis from 1901 to 1934, shows that whilst the rise in the cancer death rate has not been nearly so rapid as the fall in the rate from tuberculosis, these rates have been converging over the past thirty years, and since 1931 the recorded mortality from cancer actually exceeds that from tuberculosis.

The death rates from cancer among males and females in 1934 were 1.23 and 1.34 per 1,000 respectively; the male rate thus being 92 per cent. of the female rate, as against 88 per cent. in 1933.

The most frequent sites of fatal cancer among males during the year were stomach, 200; intestines, 127; and rectum, 57. Among females the most frequent sites were stomach, 164; breast, 158; intestines, 131; uterus, 114; and liver and gall-bladder, 56.

Particulars regarding age, sex, and parts affected, of persons whose deaths were attributed to cancer, appear in Table L.

**10. Cerebral Hæmorrhage, etc.**—The deaths assigned to this heading numbered 1,389, giving a rate of 1.09 per 1,000. This rate is 0.07 above that for 1933.

**11. Bronchitis.**—The deaths from bronchitis during the year numbered 817, giving a rate of 0.64 per 1,000, which is 0.10 lower than the rate for 1933.

**12. Pneumonia.**—There were 997 deaths from pneumonia during 1934, the rate per 1,000 being 0.78, compared with a rate of 0.93 per 1,000 in 1933.

**13. Pregnancy and Childbirth.**—The mortality of women during pregnancy and childbirth is classified under two headings, namely—(1) diseases of pregnancy, childbirth and the puerperal state, and (2) non-puerperal diseases or causes combined with pregnancy and childbirth. The causes of death shown in Table M are those to which the various deaths were assigned.

From Table N it will be seen that the deaths from diseases of pregnancy, childbirth and the puerperal state yielded a rate of 6.27 per 1,000 births, which is an increase of 0.86 on the rate for 1933, and is materially in excess of the highest rate—that for 1926—

experienced in the ten years 1924–1933. An increase was also recorded in the rate for non-puerperal diseases amongst women in pregnancy and childbirth.

**14. Deaths from Violence.**—The number of deaths ascribed to violence during the year was 590 (370 males and 220 females), which is higher than in any year since 1922, and is equivalent to 3.4 per cent. of the total deaths registered. Of these 590 deaths, 9 were attributed to homicide, 66 to suicide, and 515 to accidental causes.

In some cases the cause of death as found by the coroner's jury is not sufficiently explicit to determine whether the death was due to murder, manslaughter, or to accidental causes, and steps are taken to obtain additional information from the Ministry of Home Affairs regarding all homicidal deaths that are dealt with by the Courts of Law.

In the following table cases in which coroners returned "open verdicts" are included under the head "Other Violent Deaths," but it is possible that a number of them were due to suicide. Among the 26 deaths so returned there were 13 cases (9 males and 4 females) in which the coroners returned a verdict of "found drowned."

Of the 101 deaths from burns and scalds, 47 were of children under 5 years of age.

**15. Ill-defined Causes of Death.**—The deaths allocated to this heading during the year numbered 133 as against 121 in 1933.

Inquiries were sent to medical practitioners and coroners requesting further information as to 596 deaths, which appeared to have been indefinitely certified, representing 3.4 per cent. of the total deaths registered, and 523 replies were received, 472 containing such useful additional particulars as enabled those cases to be classified more precisely.

**16. Uncertified Deaths.**—The number of uncertified deaths was 1,170, representing 6.7 per cent. of the total deaths registered, there having been neither a medical attendant during the last illness nor an inquest held by a coroner. It will be seen from Table H that the percentage of uncertified deaths has been falling steadily over the past ten years. The number uncertified is the lowest on record and is less than half that recorded in 1922, when the uncertified deaths numbered 2,515.

The majority are confined to rural areas, 80.3 per cent. of the uncertified deaths being rural and 19.7 urban, while 65.9 per cent. were of persons aged 65 years and upwards, and 12.3 per cent. were of infants under 1 year of age.

The causes, ages, and sex of the persons whose deaths were registered as uncertified are given in Abstract VIII.

**17. Inquests.**—The circumstances of 938 deaths were considered by the coroners in 1934. Inquests were held in 563 of these cases, which represents one inquest for every 31 deaths registered. This proportion is higher than in any year since 1922. In 1933 the inquests numbered 530.

In Table P the number of cases referred to coroners in which inquests were considered unnecessary may be understated, as coroners may not always formally notify the Registrars of such cases.

**18. Ages at Death.**—Attention has been drawn in the Report for 1932 to the serious misstatements of the ages of deceased persons, frequently made to Registrars for entry in the death registers. It is

therefore necessary to regard statistics relating to deaths by age-periods with some reserve.

As registered, 13.8 per cent. of the total deaths were of children under 5 years of age, 44.8 per cent. were of persons aged 65 and upwards, and 34.6 per cent. were of persons aged 70 and upwards. There were 54 deaths of persons (13 males and 41 females) aged 95 years and upwards.

Among the deaths registered were 6 of persons whose ages at death were returned as 100 years or upwards; 1 of these deaths was a male and 5 were females. The age of the male was given as 100. Of the females, 2 were given as age 100, 1 as 101, and 2 as 106. In the absence of complete public records for remote periods, verification of the ages of all very old persons is not possible.

The ages in detail of the persons whose deaths were registered during the year are given by sexes and counties in Abstract VI.

**19. Infant Mortality.**—Deaths of infants under 1 year of age numbered 1,767, or 70 per 1,000 births registered, as compared with 80 per 1,000 in 1933.

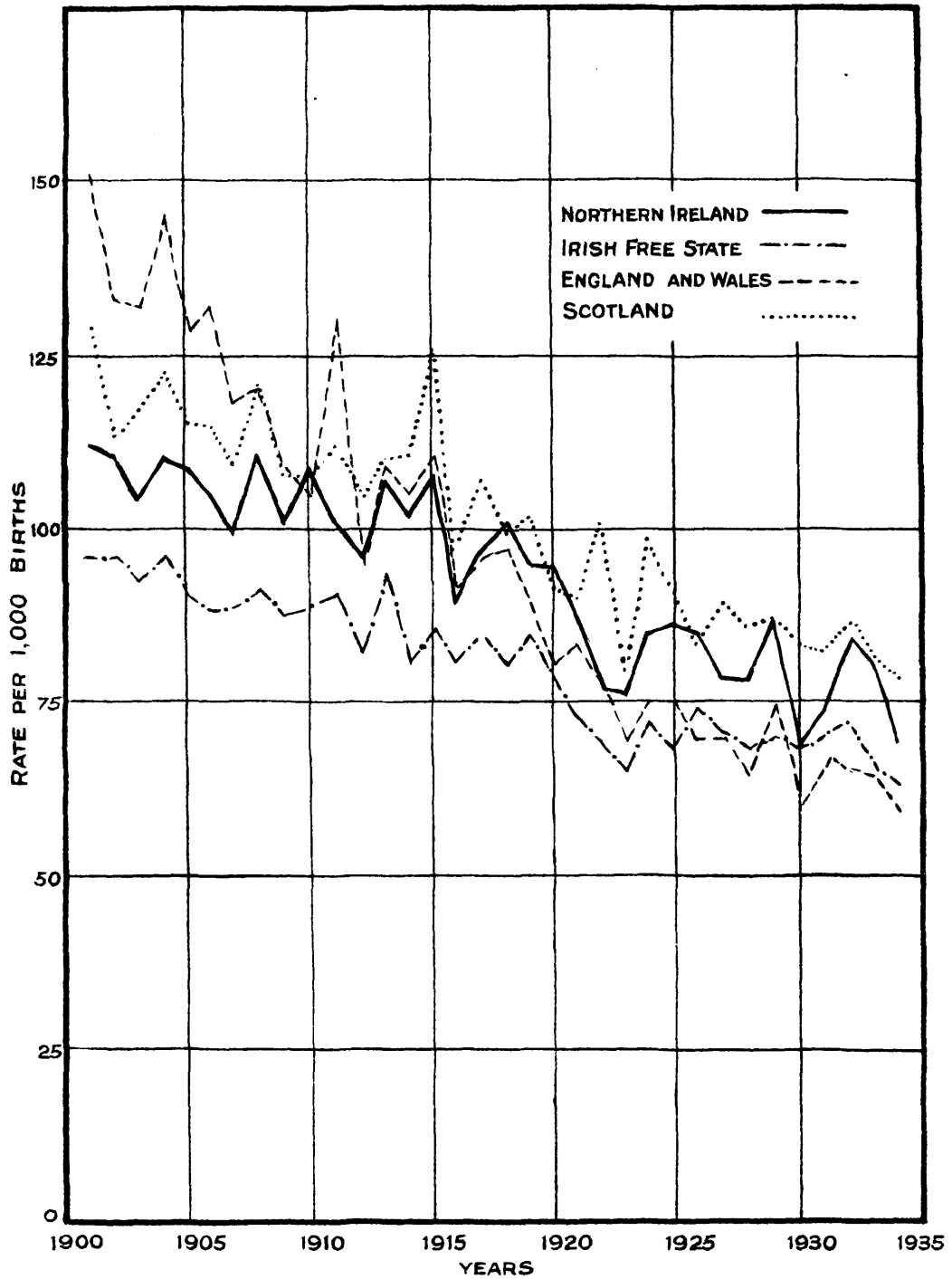
In 1934 and 1933 the rates for deaths of infants under 1 year of age were 59 and 64 per 1,000 births, respectively, for England and Wales; 78 and 81 for Scotland; and 63 and 65 for the Irish Free State.

The deaths of infants under 1 year of age include 1,054 of males and 713 of females, the former number being equivalent to 80 per 1,000 births of males and the latter to 58 per 1,000 births of females. The corresponding rates for 1933 were 87 and 71 respectively.

The infant mortality rate for the aggregate of the Urban Districts of Northern Ireland in 1934 was 79 per 1,000 births, and the rate for the aggregate of the Rural Districts was 58 per 1,000, the corresponding rates for 1933 being 93 and 63 respectively.

Table Q gives the infant mortality rates for Northern Ireland for each of the six years 1929–34, by causes of death and, for the last of these years, by sexes and age-periods. Reference to Diagram V will show that the infant mortality rate in Northern Ireland has exhibited a downward tendency since 1901, and with the exception of 1930 the rate for the year under review is the lowest yet recorded.

Table R compares the infant mortality rates for the aggregate of the urban areas with those for the aggregate of the rural areas of Northern Ireland. The differences usually found between urban and rural rates and between male and female rates are marked. The urban rates are, in general, appreciably in excess of the corresponding rural rates. Diagram VI compares the infant mortality rates from the principal causes of death, for the aggregates of the urban and rural areas, for the year 1934.

Abstract V gives the number of infant deaths, together with the number of births, for each urban and rural district of Northern Ireland.

**20. Mortality among Illegitimate Children.**—Deaths of illegitimate children under 1 year of age numbered 179 in 1934, which is equivalent to a rate of 137 per 1,000 of the illegitimate births registered, as compared with 148 in 1933. The corresponding rates for legitimate children in 1934 and 1933 were 66 and 76 per 1,000 respectively. Table S shows the deaths of illegitimate children by the principal causes in 1934, together with the mortality rates among illegitimate children for each of the years 1929–34. Most of these rates are considerably in excess of the corresponding rates for all children; particularly the rates for premature birth and injury at birth, congenital debility, etc., inattention at birth, and diarrhoea and enteritis. It should, however, be noted that the rates for some of the causes are based on very small numbers of deaths.

The death rate among illegitimate children under 1 year of age in the Irish Free State in 1934 was 265 per 1,000 illegitimate births registered.

#### § 5. POPULATION.

Estimates of the population of Northern Ireland, made for the purposes of the Registrar-General's Annual Reports, are based upon the population as ascertained at the last census, and the numbers of births and deaths registered in the meantime, adjustments being made for migration to and from non-European countries, and for the movement of the military. Since particulars of migration between this country and other European countries (including Great Britain and the Irish Free State) are not recorded, adjustment on this account, to estimates previously prepared, can be made only when the succeeding census figures become available.

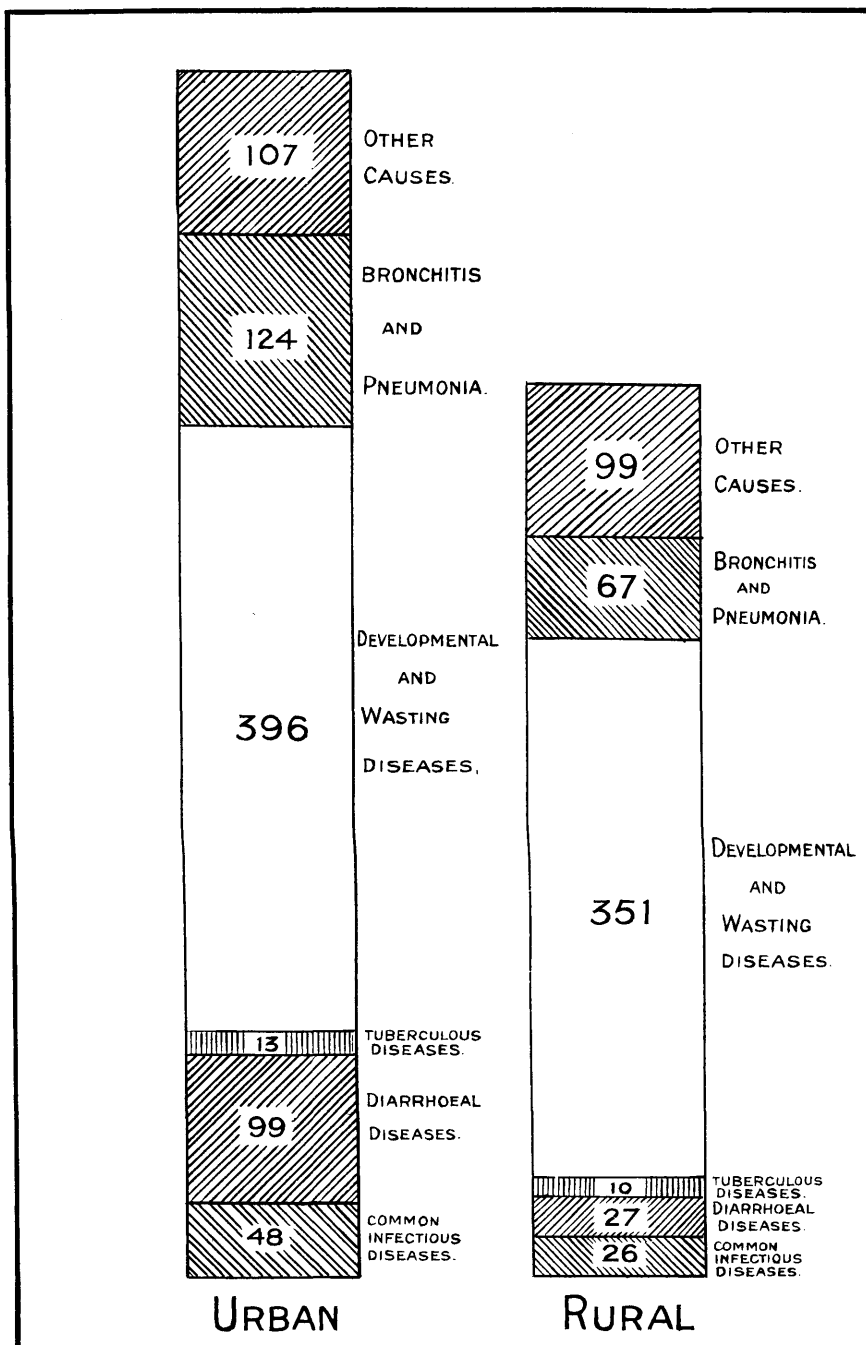
Estimates of the population as at the middle of each of the years 1911 to 1934, arrived at in the foregoing manner, are shown in Abstract XII, and the crude rates in this Report for the country as a whole have been based upon these estimates. As regards divisions of the country, however, no estimates have been made, the 1926 Census figures being used for all rates shown for these areas.

The latest enumerated population of Northern Ireland, obtained from the Census of 1926, is 1,256,561. The estimated population in the middle of 1934 was 1,279,000.

#### § 6. MIGRATION.

The returns of migration used for the purposes of the above population estimates are those published by the Board of Trade, London, which give the numbers of British migrants between Northern Ireland

and non-European countries. According to these returns, the total number of British emigrants from Northern Ireland to countries outside of Europe during the year 1934 was 838, and the British immigrants into Northern Ireland from those countries numbered 1,450. Thus, during the year 1934, there was a net movement of 612 persons into Northern Ireland. This net migration movement inwards was recorded in 1931 for the first time in the history of Northern Ireland as a separate administrative unit, but since 1932 the number has been steadily diminishing. Table T gives particulars of migration from 1924 onwards.

### § 7. THE WEATHER.

Reports on the weather experienced in Northern Ireland during each month of the year 1934, as furnished by the Director of the Meteorological Office, London, are published in the Quarterly Returns of Births, Deaths, and Marriages for that year. Table U of this report shows the Average Air Temperature, Rainfall, and Sunshine for Northern Ireland in 1934, and has been compiled from the tables published in the Quarterly Returns.

The outstanding features of the weather during the year 1934 were:—

- (1) The exceptional mildness in the months of January, February, November, and December; the mildness in the latter month being phenomenal.
- (2) An unusual high air temperature for the month of July; it was the sunniest July at Armagh since records began in 1880.
- (3) An appreciable excess of rainfall during the months of August, September, October, and December.

The temperature on the whole was slightly in excess of normal for the year, while the general rainfall represented an increase of 12 per cent. of the normal. Taking the year as a whole, sunshine did not differ greatly from normal.

The salient features of the year's weather, month by month, are given hereunder.

*January* was characterised by unsettled and rather mild weather, with southerly and westerly winds. Rainfall generally slightly exceeded the normal, while the month was sunny on the whole. In *February* the most striking feature of the weather was the exceptional scarcity of rainfall. Mean temperature was above the average; a spell of cold northerly winds prevailed from the 26th to 28th, while sunshine aggregates exceeded the average. The weather of *March* on the whole was unsettled and rather cold, sleet or snow occurring frequently. In contrast with the rest of Ireland, where the month was generally wet, rainfall was below the normal. Mean temperature for the month fell below the average, and as in January and February an excess of sunshine was recorded. *April* was generally unsettled and cool; on the whole the month was dull and wet. Mean temperature fell below the average, cold north-easterly winds prevailing during the first eleven days. Rainfall generally exceeded the normal, while sunshine was everywhere deficient. The weather of *May* was wet and rather dull. Rainfall exceeded the normal nearly everywhere, and sunshine aggregates fell below the average, but in the latter half of the month sunny days were rather frequent. *June* was dry, warm, and sunny, mean temperature being well above the average. Notable warm spells occurred around the 11th, 17th, and 30th, and rainfall was below normal. The weather of *July* was unusually warm and sunny, the period 4th to 12th being exceptionally warm. At Armagh it was the sunniest July since records began in 1880. Rainfall for the month over the country generally was well below normal. During *August* unsettled weather prevailed generally, rainfall being decidedly in excess of normal; heavy falls were experienced in some districts on the 1st. Mean temperature for the month differed little from the average. Sunshine aggregates were well below the average. *September* was distinguished by a marked excess of rainfall. Mean temperature exceeded the average generally, and, despite the excessive rainfall, sunshine aggregates were above the average locally. The weather of *October* was unsettled, dull, and wet. The last two days were unusually cold and wintry for the season, with local sleet and snow. Over the district generally rainfall amounted to more than 150 per cent. of the average. Sunshine aggregates were

deficient. In *November* the weather was rather quiet and very dry. Mean temperature was about average. Rainfall was very deficient, while, as in October, sunshine was again below normal. *December* was characterised by wet, dull, and exceptionally mild weather. Pressure was abnormally low and southerly winds predominated. The most noteworthy feature of the weather for the month was the frequent and excessive rain. As in the two previous months sunshine was deficient.
