Census 2011: Detailed Characteristics for Local Government Districts and Super Output Areas in Northern Ireland

The Northern Ireland Statistics and Research Agency (NISRA) today released further results from the 2011 Census, which was held on 27 March 2011. The pre-planned Census outputs are being published across four releases, with a target completion date of 31 March 2014.

The main first release outputs (Population and Household Estimates) were published between July 2012 and September 2012, while those for second release (Key Statistics and Quick Statistics) were published between December 2012 and April 2013.

The more complex, multivariate third release outputs (Detailed Characteristics) are being published across four phases. The first three phases have already been published, consisting of a combined total of 217 tables at the Northern Ireland level. Each phase was accompanied by a statistical bulletin. The themes and publication dates were:

Phase 1 - Health, Religion and National Identity (16 May 2013);

Phase 2 - Ethnicity, Country of Birth and Language (28 June 2013); and

Phase 3 - Housing, Labour Market and Voluntary Work (11 September 2013).

NISRA today published Phase 4, which extends 166 of the above Detailed Characteristics tables to lower level geographies, including the 18 Assembly Areas, the

26 Local Government Districts and, where feasible, the 890 Super Output Areas.

The Census is widely acknowledged as playing a fundamental and unique role in the provision of comprehensive and robust population statistics. Census outputs are needed to inform policy, to plan services for specific groups of people and, especially, to make effective use of resources through distributing them to where they are needed most.

Key users of information from the Census include central and local government, academia, organisations undertaking research, the private, business and voluntary sectors and the general public.
