Provisional results from the Northern Ireland (NI) Passenger Survey January-September 2012

During January-September 2012, an estimated 731,000 overseas visitors stayed at least one night in NI and exited through a NI port, a decrease of 3% compared with the same period in 2011 (table 1).

The estimated number of visitors visiting friends/ relatives decreased by 5%, and the number on holiday in NI decreased by 3% during January-September 2012 compared with the same period in 2011 (table 2).

During January-September 2012, overseas visitors (exiting through a NI port) stayed an estimated 4,093,000 nights, a decrease of 2% compared to January-September 2011. During the same period, those visitors spent an estimated £204m, a decrease of 3% from the same period in 2011 (table 3).

During January-September 2012, the estimated visits, nights and spend by visitors from North America increased while visits, nights and spend by GB visitors decreased (tables 1&3).

During January-September 2012, 83% of visitors, 69% of nights and 71% of estimated spend in NI were by visitors from GB. Fifty-six percent of visitors, 60% of nights and 43% of estimated expenditure in NI was by those in NI to visit friends/relatives.

Background

Information on **overseas visitors** to NI is collected through the Northern Ireland Passenger Survey (NIPS). The survey methodology may be viewed at: http://www.detini.gov.uk/deti-stats-index/tourism-statistics/stats-overseas-visitors/stats-nips-methodology.htm

Overseas visitors include anyone reporting their country of residence as outside Northern Ireland or Republic of Ireland. The estimates published in this report refer to those overseas visitors who stayed at least one night in Northern Ireland and exited Northern Ireland via one of the air or sea ports.

Sampling variability

The NIPS is a sample survey and estimates obtained from it are subject to sampling variability. Table 5 details the confidence intervals of the visitor and expenditure estimates by country of residence.

Data during the earlier parts of the year are more likely to exhibit larger variations due to smaller counts for each of the cells and the impact of unusual events.

Rounding

Figures in the tables have been rounded to the nearest thousand and may not add to the figure shown as the total. Year on year percentage change is based on the unrounded figures.

Data revisions

Tourism estimates are produced to provide timely data to the tourism industry and Government policy makers. The estimates may be subject to revision due to improvements to the survey/analysis methodology or the inclusion of data returned after the publication date. The figures in this document are the most up-to-date available at the time of publication.
