MID-YEAR POPULATION ESTIMATES NORTHERN IRELAND (2004)

9:30am - Friday 29 July 2005

The Northern Ireland Statistics and Research Agency today released statistics on the estimated size and structure of the population of Northern Ireland at 30 June 2004. The published information includes a breakdown of the population by age and gender at Local Government District, Health and Social Services Board, Education and Library Board, Parliamentary Constituency, NUTS III area and Northern Ireland levels.

KEY RESULTS

- The estimated population of Northern Ireland at 30 June 2004 was 1,710,300, an increase of 7,700 (0.5 per cent) on the 2003 population of 1,702,600 and an increase of 66,600 (4.1 per cent) on the 1994 population of 1,643,700.
- The 7,700 increase in the Northern Ireland population between 2003 and 2004 was a result of the following components of change:
 - 22,000 births;
 - 14,600 deaths;
 - net inward migration to Northern Ireland of 800 people; and
 - net outward movement of 600 people in other changes, principally changes to Her Majesty's Forces stationed in Northern Ireland.
- The number of children (aged under 16 years) in Northern Ireland has declined from 388,100 to 383,300 (1.2 per cent) between 2003 and 2004, reflecting the falling birth rate since the mid 1980s.
- The Northern Ireland populations of working and pensionable age have increased by 0.8 per cent (from 1,043,900 to 1,051,700) and 1.7 per cent (from 270,600 to 275,200) respectively between 2003 and 2004.
- In the ten-year period since 1994 the number of children has fallen from 417,900 to 383,300 a fall of 8.3 per cent, in contrast the number of pensioners has increased from 250,400 to 275,200 a rise of 9.9 per cent.

Local Government Districts

- Among Local Government Districts, Down had the greatest proportionate increase in population (2.4 per cent) and Armagh had the greatest decrease in population (1.0 per cent).
- The largest natural increase of population (births less deaths) in percentage terms was 0.8 per cent in Newry & Mourne Local Government District.
- Newry and Mourne was the Local Government District with the highest proportion of children among its population (25.4 per cent), while North Down had the lowest proportion (18.9 per cent).
- Castlereagh Local Government District had the highest proportion of the population of pensionable age (19.6 per cent) and Limavady Local Government District had the lowest proportion (12.4 per cent).

Parliamentary Constituencies

- South Down had the greatest proportionate increase in population of the Parliamentary Constituencies (1.9 per cent), whilst all four Parliamentary Constituencies covering Belfast Local Government District showed a decrease in population between 2003 and 2004.
- In Belfast East Parliamentary Constituency the number of deaths was greater than the number of births. In all other Parliamentary Constituencies the number of births exceeded the number of deaths.
- Belfast West Parliamentary Constituency had the highest proportion of children among its population (25.8 per cent), while Belfast South had the lowest proportion (17.0 per cent).
- Belfast East Parliamentary Constituency had the highest proportion of the population of pensionable age (22.0 per cent) while Foyle Parliamentary Constituency had the lowest proportion (12.5 per cent).

NOTES TO EDITORS

- 1. The Northern Ireland mid year population estimate is an estimate of the usually resident population of Northern Ireland including Her Majesty's Forces stationed here. The births and deaths recorded in this release are those registered by the General Register Office between mid-2003 and mid-2004. A more detailed breakdown of these and other statistics will be published later in the year in the "Registrar General Annual Report (NI) 2004".

NUTS areas were created by the Statistical Office of the European Communities (Eurostat) as a single hierarchical classification of spatial units used for statistical production across the European Union.
